To all to whom these presents shall come, Greetings.

Know Ye, That for and in consideration of the sum of twelve and one half cents per acre paid into the office of the Entry-Taker of **SMITH COUNTY**, and entered on the **5**TH **DAY OF OCTOBER 1825**, pursuant to the provisions of an Act of the General Assembly of the said State passed on **22**ND **DAY OF NOVEMBER**, **1823**, **BY NO. 450**. There is granted by the said State of Tennessee unto JOHN BAILIF a certain Tract of Land containing **FIFTY ACRES** by Survey bearing the date **19**TH **DAY OF DECEMBER 1825**, lying in said county.

On the South Side of said CANEY FORK RIVER and bounded as follows to West. Beginning at NICHOLAS old line and adjoins and lived. Running South one hundred and ten poles to a Beech and Sugar Tree thence West one hundred and twenty six poles to two Black Ashes and a hackberry thence North forty four and a half poles to a stake on the South boundary of JOHN CONGER'S FIFTY ACRES tract. Thence East eighty eight poles to said CONGER'S South East Corner. Thence East thirty seven poles to the beginning.

With the Hereditaments and appurtenances. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land, with its appurtenances, to the said **JOHN BAILIF** and his heirs forever. In witness whereof, **WILLIAM CARROLL** Governor of the State of Tennessee, hath hereunto set his hand and caused the Great Seal of the State to be affixed, at Nashville on the **30**TH **DAY OF OCTOBER IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND TWENTY SIX** and of the Independence of the United States, the 57th.
