I THOMAS BAILIFF have this day bargained and sold and do hereby transfer and convey to WILLIAM BATES and his heirs forever for the consideration of twenty five dollars to me paid a tract of land in the State of Tennessee, Smith County and District No. 21 containing by estimation FOUR ACRES be the same more or less and bounded as follows beginning on a creek at the N.C. Corner near the SPRING BRANCH running a south west course to a creek thence a north west course to a creek with my OLD SAWMILL LINE TO THE BEGINNING AT THE CORNER. To have and to hold the same to the said WILLIAM BATES his heirs and assigns forever. I do covenant with the said WILLIAM BATES that I am lawfully seized of said land and have a good right to convey it and that the same is unencumbered. I do further covenant and bind myself and my heirs and representatives to warrant and ever defend the title to the said land and every part thereof to the said WILLIAM BATES his heirs and assigns the lawful claim of all persons whatsoever this the 22nd Day of July 1847.
