**NOTE:** It appears **EDWARD BAYLY** changed his name to **BAYLIFF OR BAILIFF** at or before he arrived in Chester County, Pennsylvania, and appears in the 1740 Tax Records.

1714 EDWARD BAYLIFF [BAYLY] was born 1714 in Dublin, Dublin, Ireland. EDWARD was christened 12-April-1714 at Saint Peter and Saint Kevin Church in Dublin, Dublin, Ireland. His father was EDWARD BAYLY. It appears that EDWARD BAYLY changed his name from BAYLY to BAYLIFF when he first appears in the 1740 tax records of Chester County, Pennsylvania [maybe the tax man didn't understand the name and spelled it on the tax records wrong and the name stuck]. The evolution of EDWARD'S name appears to be BAYLY to BAYLIFF to BAILIFF. The name was BAYLY in Ireland, appears to have changed to BAYLIFF when he arrived in Chester County, Pa, and in his later years EDWARDS name starts appearing as BAILIFF.

**CINDY MCCACHERN** of Edmond, Oklahoma, made the best analysis of the early material found to date on **EDWARD** and **THOMAS** [SR] **BAILIFF**. The data found on family search for **EDWARD BAYLY** fits our **EDWARD BAYLIFF** in Chester County, Pa. **EDWARD BAYLY** born 1714 Dublin, Ireland and **THOMAS BAYLIFF** [SR] probably born 1726 in Dublin, Ireland, [place of birth of **THOMAS BAYLIFF** [SR] is not Chester County but Ireland probably Dublin] are brothers. The supporting evidence for this decision is the fact **THOMAS** [SR] **BAILIFF** is appointed executor of **EDWARD BAYLIFF'S ESTATE** in Chester County, Pa., plus **THOMAS** [SR] received 100% of **EDWARDS ESTATE**. The father/son relationship is not strong since **EDWARD** would have been the father of **THOMAS** [SR] at 14 years of age [not impossible but not very likely]. The Chester County tax records show that **EDWARD** was never married in Chester County, Pa. **Being brothers is a very strong possibility**.

Until future evidence is discovered that proves otherwise, the conclusion is to accept the following: EDWARD BAYLY [Gen. 1] died probably in Dublin, Ireland, and the age is not known at this time. Two of his sons EDWARD [Gen. 2] born 1714 and THOMAS [SR] [Gen. 2] born in 1726 moved together from Ireland to Chester County, Pa. EDWARD BAYLIFF left no known descendants. THOMAS BAYLIFF [SR] left many descendants throughout the Midwest and South [including North Carolina, Tennessee, Kentucky, Indiana, Illinois and other

states]. Both of the names **THOMAS** and **EDWARD** show up in **THOMAS [SR]** descendants. The possibility is good that there are other siblings who stayed in Ireland. The possibility also exist that there were no other living siblings when **EDWARD** and **THOMAS [SR]** left Ireland. **EDWARD** first appeared in Chester County tax records in 1740. It is assumed it may take a year or two for **EDWARD** to appear on the tax rolls placing their arrival at 1738 or 1739.

1740 **DANIEL BAYLIF** is taxed in East Marlboro, Chester County, Pa, tax records. (This person is not a **BAILIFF** but **DANIEL BAILY** son of **JOEL BAILY**)
