To all to whom these presents shall come, greeting. Know ye that we for and in consideration of the sum of fifty Shillings for every hundred acres hereby granted paid into the treasury by ROBERT BAKER have given and granted and by these presents do give and grant unto the said ROBERT BAKER a tract of land containing six hundred and eighteen acres lying and being in our County of Orange on the waters of NEW HOPE adjoining his other entry and adjoining the land of David Craig and JOSEPH HASTINGS. Beginning at a black oak thence north ten chains to a black oak then east eighty chains to a black jack. Then north seventy five chains to a hickory then west sixty seven and a half chains to a stake. Then south thirteen chains to a hickory. Then to the first station, as be the plat here unto annexed doth appear, together with all woods, waters, mines, minerals, hereditaments appurtenances to the said lands belonging or appertaining. To hold to the said ROBERT BAKER his heirs and assigns forever yielding and paying to whole sums of money yearly or otherwise, as our general assembly from time to time may direct provided that the said ROBERT to a general court this grant registered in the registers office of our said County of Orange within twelve months from the date hereof otherwise the same shall expire and of no effect. In testimony whereof we have caused our great seal to be hereunto affixed. Alexander Martin Esquire, our Governor Captain General and Commander in Chief at Fairfield the **twenty fifth day of October** in the seventh year of our independence and in the year of one afore one thousand seven hundred eighty two.
