To all to whom these presents shall come. Greetings. Know ye that we for and in consideration of fifty shillings for every hundred acres hereto granted paid into our treasury by **ROBERT BAKER** has given granted and by these presents shall give and grant unto the said **ROBERT BAKER** a tract of land containing two hundred and twenty five acres and giving and being in the County of Orange on the branch of NEW HOPE and Eno River binding on the land of Joseph Hastings. Beginning at a post oak running thence west fifty five chains to a white oak then south thirty one chains to a white oak then east fifty five chains to a black oak then north forty one chains to the first station, as by the plat hereunto annexed doth appear together with all woods waters mines minerals hereditaments and appurtenances to the said land belonging or appertaining. To hold to the said **ROBERT BAKER** his heirs or assigns forever, yielding and to us such sums of money yearly or otherwise. Our general assembly from time to time may provide always that the said **ROBERT BAKER** shall cause this grant to be registered in the registers office of our said County of Orange within twelve months from the date hereof otherwise the same void and of no effect. In testimony whereof we have caused our great seal to be hereunto affixed. Witness also under Martin Esquire our Governor Captain General and Commander at Fairfield. The twenty fifth day of October in the seventh year of our Independence in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty two.
