1. 1730. John ffarr: assault and battery upon Leonard Milburn; Joseph Growden prosecutor for the King; jury: James Silver, Thomas Eastland, John Jones, James Coal, **ROBERT BAKER**, Edward Dougharty, William Evans, William Mitchell, John Davison, Robert Blackshaw, John Mitchel and John David find him guilty; ordered to pay fine of two shillings and six pence.

Aug 3, 1732. William Hughs: felony; two sows belonging to Joseph Light; says he is not quilty; jury: Walter Denny, Robert During, James Hutchenson, Samuel Smith, John Douglass, Alexander Rich, **ROBERT BACKER (Baker)**, William Sherril, Thomas Wilkin, Patrick Moor, James Cook, William White finds him not guilty.

Aug 3, 1732. Hugh Young and **ROBERT BAKER** were allowed to traverse with one horse as Pedlars.

6. July 4, 1741. this indenture July 4, 1741, **CALEB BAKER** of Conestoga Township, gunsmith and Martha his wife to Jacob Good of Conestoga Township, yeoman, 225 pounds for 250 acres. Land is located on Pequea Creek on the Susquehanna River, neighbors—David Jones, late of **ROBERT BAKER** deceased. The 250A is part of a larger tract of 500 acres. The whole tract was first surveyed to John French of New Castle on Delaware River, gentleman, who with his wife, Eve, did by indenture dated 15 June 1720 grant the 500 Acres to Joseph Rodman of the City of Philadelphia merchant. Joseph by his will devised land to Sarah his wife and her heirs. Sarah by indenture dated 14 April 1724 granted land to **ROBERT BAKER** the father of Caleb. **ROBERT** die intestate. Orphans Court ordered the personal goods be sold to satisfy his debts. By indenture dated 6 Feb 1738/39 land was granted to John Cunningham of Landcaster County, Pa, yeoman who by indenture dated 7 Feb 1738 granted to **CALEB BAKER**. Patnet was granted by John, Thomas and Richard Penn on 23 Oct 1739 for 500 acres and recorded in Book A, Vol 10, Page 267—**CALEB BAKER**. **Martha Baker**---Sealed_ and delivered by **MARTHA BAKER**, Maww Yatt, John Jones---Received of Jacob_ Good 275 pounds. **MARTHA BAKER**. Witness Olson Landus. Acknowledged 15 July 1741 David Jones----Received None---certified deed was recorded Benjamin Longenecker.

7. 1-Mar-1754. D89. Jacob Good and wife Elizabeth and John Good and wife Elizabeth mortgaged land to James Hamilton, Lt. Gov, 400 pounds on 89 acres on Pequea Creek on Susq. River David Jones, late of **ROBERT BAKER** deceased. (Descent as in B577 for 250 acres to Jacob Good) Also 165 acres on Pequea Creek: Samuel Royer, n. or l. of William Middleton. (Descent to John Good as in B579). 1 Mar 1754, 4 Mar 1754.
