Mrs. Angelina Pease, wife of Louis Pease died at her residence near West Union, February 13, 1888.

The subject of this sketch was born on what was known as the French Donation near Vincennes, Indiana, July 8, 1814. She moved to this county in October of the same year. She was the daughter of John handy. Her brother, Thomas Handy, once sheriff of this county, is said to have been the first white male child born in this county.

She was married to Louis Pease August 23, 1832. Except for one year in New Orleans with her husband, she has lived all her life in this county.

She was the mother of twelve children, three of whom survive her.

She had a stroke of paralysis about three years ago from which she never recovered. Angelina was not a member of any church. It is a sad time for her aged companion, who has been a life long companion.

REV. THOMAS BAILIFF preached the funeral discourse at the house. Her remains were then taken to the John Handy Cemetery and interred.
